# Who We Are

Bethesda Metro Area Village (BMAV) is part of a national aging-in-place movement dedicated to providing services, social opportunities and community support that allow people to remain in their own homes as they age. We help seniors live at home safely and independently in the community they know and love.

• In just our second year, BMAV grew to 90 members: 29 Full Service and 61 Social members. We have members from Battery Park, South Bradley Hills, Whitehall Manor, Edgemoor, English Village, Greenwich Forest and beyond. We welcome and accept Social members from anywhere in Bethesda not served by another village, and offer subsidized memberships to those seniors who express a need.



•Social members enjoy our robust programming, making connections in the neighborhood and helping their neighbors.

•Full Service members can in addition receive volunteerprovided services including: rides, light home repair, absentowner services, technology assistance, and friendly visits or calls.

•30 trained and vetted neighbors (members and non-members)

volunteer to help their community. We partner with Montgomery Volunteer Center to seek volunteers and also work with students earning Student Service Learning credit.

• In 2018 we connected over 200 seniors with services or programs.

# <u>What We Do</u>

In 2018, we created or partnered on 116 events with over 700 attendees, including speakers, social and health-related activities and learning opportunities. Our vibrant programming helps connect members with their community.



• This year we launched a new collaboration with the Bethesda Connie Morella Library to co-sponsor monthly

programming for seniors. These events are free and open to the public and help both the village and the library with outreach to our neighborhood and beyond.

• We expanded our small "Special Interest Groups" where village members get to know each other at regular meetings over a shared interest. These groups now include arts, birdwatching, board games, bridge, aging discussion group, hiking and knitting.
